

VAR Uniform Policy

Vision Academy @ Riverside students are young professionals who are learning the habits of adult professionals, including the habits of professional dress. Full school uniforms must be worn at all times. Parents will be informed if their child is out of uniform, and will be asked to bring the proper uniform to the school immediately. If this is not possible, the student will be required to wear a substitute uniform (if available) and will receive a uniform violation (see back).

Monday-Thursday

Young Men:

- Khaki or navy slacks or uniform shorts
- White, navy, light blue or yellow polo or Oxford shirt
- Navy or white long sleeves may be worn underneath
- White or navy sweater or cardigan (optional)
- Gym shoes, boots, or dress shoes



Young Ladies:

- Khaki or navy skirt or jumper (must be to fingertips)
- Khaki or navy slacks or uniform shorts
- White blouse
- White, navy, light blue, or yellow polo
- Navy or white long sleeves may be worn underneath
- White or navy sweater or cardigan (optional)
- Gym shoes, boots, or dress shoes
- Tights or socks

Friday

- VAR spiritwear t-shirts
- Jeans (any color but NO rips)
- Gym shoes or boots

*If your child is not in spiritwear, they must dress in full uniform.

*NOTE: If your child is not wearing gym shoes and has Gym, please send gym shoes to change into.

Students will **NOT** be permitted to wear the following items in school:

- Other colored polos
- Coats, jackets, sweatshirts, or hoodies inside of the building
- Clothing bearing any logos, messages, or other insignia (unless it is a VAR logo)
- Slacks that are skin-tight, oversized, low-rise, baggy, or inappropriately altered
- Sweatpants, leggings, or gym shorts
- Hats, bandanas, scarves, excessive jewelry, visible body piercings (other than ears)
- Visible body art
- Sandals, sliders, or flip-flops

Violation

- Shoes** - Must be gym shoes, boots, or dress shoes
- Pants/Shorts** – Must be khaki or navy. Cannot be skin-tight, oversized, low-rise, or baggy.
- Skirts / Jumper** – Must be khaki or navy. Length must be appropriate.
- Shirt** - Must be white, navy, light blue, or yellow polo or button down. T-shirts without collars are not permitted. (Long sleeve t-shirts underneath must be navy or white)
- Fridays** – Must be a VAR spiritwear t-shirt, jeans (without rips), gym shoes or boots
